NLSA ACCREDITATION – WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- 1. Some statistics
 - a. Nationally 520 schools with or without an early childhood program accredited
 - b. Nationally 80 freestanding early childhood programs accredited
 - c. Nationally 56 high schools accredited
 - d. Florida-Georgia 37 schools with or without an early childhood program accredited
 - e. Florida-Georgia 12 freestanding early childhood centers accredited
 - f. Florida-Georgia 2 schools in process for the first time
- 2. Process for schools scheduled to begin the re-accreditation self-study
 - a. July/August contact administrators to determine which process would be most beneficial to their school (LS Portal has all the self-study processes)
 - b. August-October schools make district and NLSA application and pay fees (forms are available on the FL-GA District website)
 - c. September District Accreditation Commission (DAC) meeting appoints a consultant to the school
 - d. October-January consultant visits school to get them going in the new process
 - e. October-May school should report progress on a monthly basis to the consultant
 - f. Early June consultant reports school progress at the DAC meeting
 - g. Early August administrator is informed as to when and what to present to the DAC in September (the morning of the first day of the Educators Conference)
 - h. September administrator presents progress to the DAC
 - i. September-April complete self-study and have team visit
- 3. Dates to remember if a school is in Years 1-4 of the accreditation cycle
 - a. Early October annual fee due to NLSA in St. Louis, and to the FL-GA District
 - b. April 15 Cumulative Annual Report (CAR) due to FL-GA District in Orlando
- 4. What's unique in our district?
 - a. 12 trained consultants/team captains
 - b. 3 DAC meetings per year
 - > September face-to-face meeting
 - ➤ January electronic meeting
 - ➤ June teleconference meeting (recommending continuing or reaccreditation)
 - c. Administrators meet the DAC to demonstrate readiness for a team visit
 - d. Support of Mark and Lynda
- 5. Accreditation status
 - a. Provisional usually involves safety issues, curriculum, 3-year financial plan, required attachments, inadequate School Improvement Plan (goals/objectives/strategies)
 - b. In good standing
 - c. Exemplary

- > 90% general indicators of success rated "met in full"
- > academic preparation of students
- > stakeholder and community perception of the school
- > replicable best practices
