▲ President's Equip Conference: One of the results of this successful conference for professional and lay leaders is a leadership summit for laity beginning next August. Professional church worker events are already well established.

▲ Grace Place Wellness: From October 16-20 President Walton served as chaplain for the first Grace Place Wellness Retreat in the District. Led by Dr. Darrell Zimmerman, it was held in Sarasota with nine clergy couples participating. "It was a wonderful week for me to have with these couples as God worked in our midst," Walton said. A second retreat is being planned for early 2018 to focus on those recovering from

Breakouts for adult leaders are included in the programming for both the Middle and the High School Gatherings.

▲ Emergent Leaders 2018: Eleven participants have registered for the next session of Emergent Leaders, set for first quarter 2018. A number of District Board members have participated in the process.

▲ Veterans of the Cross: March 5-7, 2018, are the dates for the next Veterans of the Cross Retreat, once again to be held at the

presenting. ▲ Lay Leader Summit: A summit to help equip and encourage lay leaders in partnering in their local ministry for the sake of Jesus is tentatively set for August 23-25. Planning is in the very early stages.

▲ District Pastors Conference: Planning has begun for the Florida-Georgia Pastors Conference, September 24-26, 2018, at the Hilton Daytona Beach prior to the **Educators Conference, set** for September 26-28, 2018, at the same venue.

OUTREACH:

▲ Mission Advisory Board: The MAC is going through some transition as the District continues with the vacancy in the Executive Director of Missions role after Rev. Four emerging missions are in the works: Lake Wood Ranch adjoining Sarasota and Bradenton, FL; The Pelican in Naples, FL; Port St. Lucie Cornerstone Mission, a daughter of Redeemer/ Stuart, FL; and Missionary at Large Hispanic Atlanta. ▲ Outreach Initiative: The

Outreach Initiative with **Lutheran Hour Ministries** is being reshaped and will primarily provide resources on the web through a portal. The new director is Rev. Tony Cook, who said he would like Florida-Georgia to serve in the beta testing section of this new format and

▲ Five Two Miami: The District will begin specific work in the Miami area with Oscar Benavides. who has joined the staff of Five Two. The goal is to see how the District can revitalize and begin new ministries in this urban context.

▲ Revitalization: The District is working with the congregation in Tifton, GA, to see if revitalization is possible. Rev. Doug Hudson of Trinity/Albany, GA, is working a few days a week with the people in Tifton.

▲ 2018 District Servant **Event:** Jeremiah Bauer, DCE, St. Paul/Boca Raton, FL, is spearheading the planning for the District High School Servant Event that will engage youth in the ongoing recovery work in SW Florida or the Florida Keys.

▲ 2018 High School Youth Gathering: Joe Guagliardo, recently retired Youth Director at Faith/Merritt Island, FL, is leading the planning team for the February 2-4 event at Sawgrass Marriott in Ponte Vedra Beach.

▲ 2019 LCMS Youth Gathering: Youth and adult leaders will gather **July 11-15** in Minneapolis. MN, under the theme "Real. Present God." Each District appoints a coordinator who attends an orientation and training session early in 2018 to prepare them to provide timely information, help coordinate potential District events and generally be the "go to" person for Gathering information. Joe Guagliardo will be serving that role for Florida-Georgia.

Hurricane Irma Recovery Continues


Florida-Georgia congregations continue to recover from the damaging September visit of Hurricane Irma, which came ashore at Marco Island, FL, continued up the west coast of the state and into Georgia before exiting just south and west of Atlanta.

"Due to the size of Irma, there was no part of the Florida-Georgia District that was left untouched," reported John Elliott, District Business Manager and Disaster Relief Coordinator.

Some storm stats:

- -48 congregations reported damage, mostly in
- -Two congregations sustain sizeable damages: Grace/ Key West and Marco Lutheran/Marco Island.
- -Donations for disaster assistance through October 24, 2017: \$99,166.25. -Two congregations have received \$35,200 thus far
- from LCMS disaster relief.
