GOD SPEAKS read isaiah 49:1-7

And now, says the Lord, who formed me from the womb to be His Servant, to bring Jacob back to Him so that Israel might be gathered to Him; for I am honored in the sight of the Lord, and my God is my strength – He says, "It is not enough for you to be my servant, raising up the tribes of Jacob and restoring the protected ones of Israel. I will also make You a Light for the Nations, to be My salvation to the ends of the earth." (vv5-6).

Why did God send Jesus? Why do we celebrate the Advent and Nativity of our Lord? These verses from Isaiah are a great summary of God's Great Sending. Isaiah reminds us that God's servant, Jesus, was formed from the womb to bring Israel back to God. But there's more! It was not enough for Jesus to bring God's beloved Israel back; Jesus is also sent as a Light for the Nations, to bring God's salvation to the ends of the earth! Advent focuses our attention on this Great Sending, God sending Jesus to bring the Gift of Salvation to all people everywhere, to the ends of the earth.

Of course, Jesus accomplished His Father's will by His perfect life and His all-sufficient suffering and death on the cross. Because He has done this for us, we worship and adore Him! But it is not enough to worship and adore Him as the Christ Child – we honor and praise Him as our Living Savior and we share this Good News of Great Joy with the Nations.
