WORKSHOP SESSIONS A

A-1 Faithfulness and AI: Building a Relational and Redemptive AI Policy

Dr. Eugene Kim (Chair of Organizational Change & Professor of Leadership, Concordia University – Irvine, CA)

Artificial intelligence is rapidly reshaping how we live, learn, and lead. This session helps participants think theologically and practically about AI's role in ministry and education. Explore how to evaluate tools through a Lutheran lens, establish healthy guardrails, and leverage technology in ways that strengthen—not replace—relationships. You'll leave with a clearer framework for leading confidently in a tech-shaped world.

A-2 Faithful Innovation in a Changing World

Participants will explore real examples of innovation that increase teacher capacity, improve student outcomes, and create space for deeper relationships.

Join us in this breakout to grow in awareness of where we may be stuck and gain clarity for Biblical alternatives that by God's grace we may flourish.
